<u>Immutable</u>: This attribute means that God is eternally the same in His being. He does not change over time; He is the same yesterday, today, and forever. His nature and character are constant and unchanging.

<u>Invisible</u>: God is spirit and cannot be seen with human eyes. He exists beyond the physical senses, and His essence is not visible to us. He dwells in unapproachable light.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. Pastor Jamie mentioned that our understanding of God's attributes is just scratching the surface. In what ways can acknowledging the limits of our understanding of God lead to a deeper faith and trust in Him?
- 2. Isaiah's vision of God in the temple highlights God's holiness and majesty. What does Isaiah's response to God's holiness teach us about our own approach to worship and reverence? How have we lost our position of reverence in the 21st century?
- 3. The message highlights the continuous revelation of God's holiness by the seraphim. When is the last time you had an "ahha" moment with the Lord? What are some practical ways we can seek fresh revelations of God's character in our daily lives?
- 4. The message discusses the eternal nature of God and His unchanging throne. How does the concept of God's immutability provide comfort and assurance in your life?
- 5. Pastor Jamie describes worship as an encounter with God, not just singing songs. How can we cultivate a worship experience that focuses on encountering God rather than just going through the motions?

Ministry Time:

Pastor Jamie mentioned that God reveals our sins not to shame us but to cleanse us. Pray for anyone who has been struggling with feeling condemnation for their sins instead of seeing the cleansing that God wants to bring.
